It is a philosophy for effective teaching that involves providing students with a variety of avenues to acquire and demonstrate content. Our differentiated classrooms are responsive to the diverse levels of student needs for both acceleration and remediation. In this environment, all students can be include and feel successful. Clear guidelines, or rubrics, are set out for independent or group work that matches each student's individual expectations for learning. Differentiation compliments our multi-sensory learning environment and allows for teachers to identify needs to re-teach an idea or to extend the higher order thinking of more advanced learners within subjects.
